If you are one of approximately 44 million German Americans living in the U.S. as of 2016, and if you're interested in genealogy or your family tree, imagine how amazing it would be to find out that one of your relatives fought in the American War of Independence and which side they fought on! It could have been the British or American side. This event will highlight the lesser known Regiment of the Royal Deux-Ponts made up mostly of Germans which joined George Washington's armies, marched across Cooch's Bridge in Newark, Delaware, and went on to Yorktown, Virginia, where they helped end the war by defeating Britain's Lord Cornwallis and his armies of British and German Hessian soldiers.


